This group would be a rehabilitative group here at the prison run by inmates, but aided by select members of the community. We hope that you will read all of the information we have provided here and thoughtfully consider some of the events currently playing out in society, and also consider the objective of this group is to send men back into the community as assets to LAW-ENFORCEMENT, assets to INDIVIDUAL CITIZENS, assets to FREEDOM and the RULE OF LAW. Yes this a very tall order, however the right type of LEADERSHIP will accomplish anything.

So I heard your adds running on the radio (KSCO) "Veterans of the Military, Education, Healthcare etc." (I cannot listen to your program as I cannot pick-up that station) So I had to do some networking to get your address. Your name and who comprises your group tells us that your assemblage is made up of LEADERS and this is the most important reason we are writing to you, we are lacking real LEADERSHIP here, infact there is a LEADERSHIP vacuum in the same way that other "places" have had LEADERSHIP issues where the brave men and women of the United States stepped-up and made SACRIFICES, there are fixable LEADERSHIP issues here and with a joint effort and the right coalition of individuals we could make a difference in a major way and start a collective conversation that would resonate throughout the country.

So lets consider some of the ways the LEADERSHIP vacuum is effecting us. CDCR's approach to rehabilitation (however sincere) is lacking in the following ways: CDCR offers rehabilitative programs lots of them AA, NA, AL-ANON and just about anything else an inmate can dream up. Some of these programs offer some good stuff, but there are other systemic issues that prevail here in prison that adversely effect the rehabilitative process.
